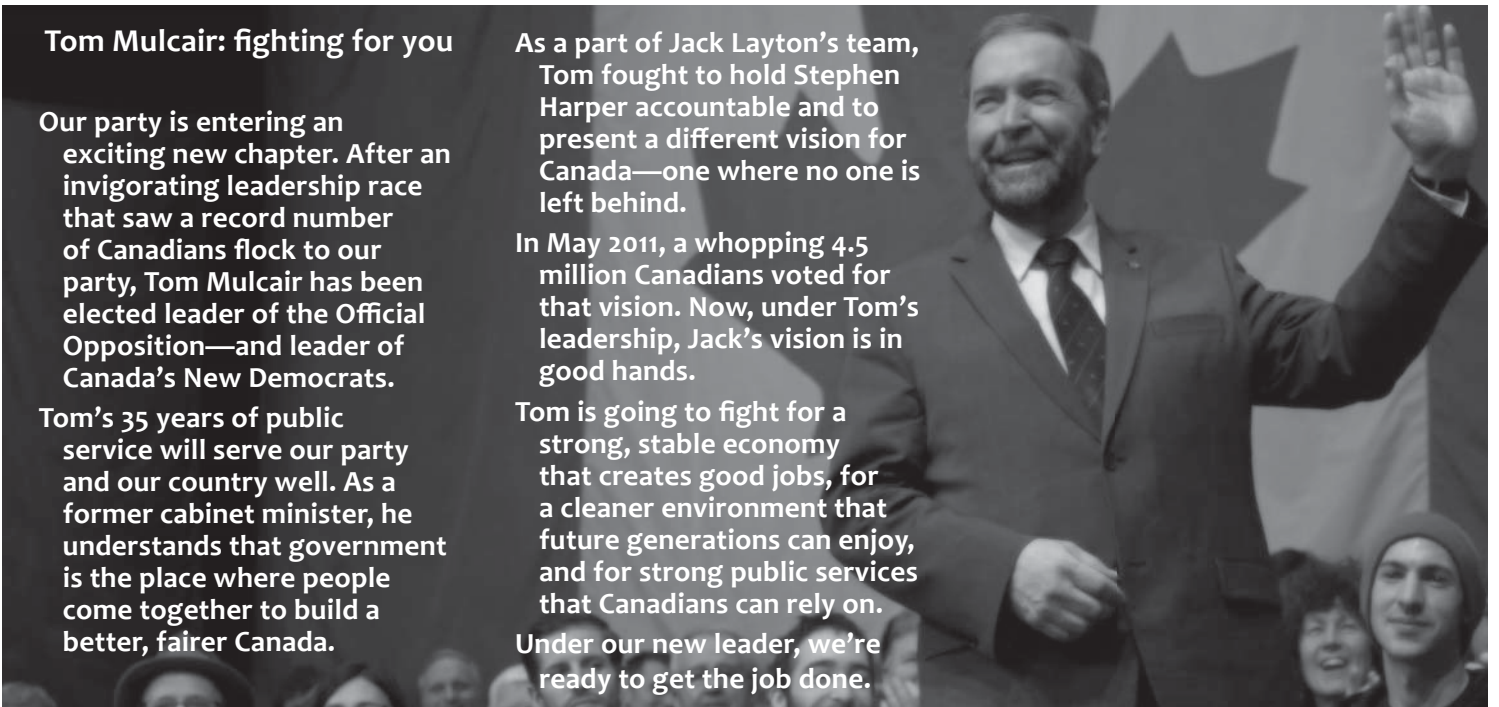
Tom's 35 years of public service will serve our party and our country well. As a former cabinet minister, he understands that government is the place where people come together to build a better, fairer Canada.

Speak out on the Conservative budget



Conservatives slash pensions and health care

With so much at stake, this year's Conservative budget could have been the most important in two decades. It could have set out a clear roadmap to create jobs and strengthen the services you rely on. Instead, this budget is a total failure.

After promising not to cut pensions or health care transfers, they are doing just that—attacking these cornerstones of our country.

They are raising the Old Age Security eligibility age from 65 to 67. That will take \$12,000 out of your pocket and force you to work two years longer. They are slashing this vital program despite expert advice that it is sustainable.

This budget also rewrites the federal formula for funding health

care—short-changing provinces by \$31 billion. For Canadians, that will mean fewer doctors, longer wait-times and more frustration when you get sick.

And for every nine dollars in reckless cuts, they've invested barely one dollar back in job creation. Meanwhile, experts warn that deep cuts in uncertain times could even throw Canada back into recession.

New Democrats are proposing concrete incentives to create good-paying jobs. And we're fighting to protect vital services like health care and public pensions. These are the services that ensure no one is left behind. And that's a value we can't let Mr. Harper sacrifice.

That's why we're holding budget review sessions across the country and fighting to ensure your voice is heard.

PETER IN THE HOUSE ~ on Budget 2012 and cuts to services to Canadian families

Mr. Speaker, what we have seen tonight is a broken promise to Canadian people. We saw the commitments that were made prior to May 2. We saw the commitments made by this Prime Minister to our former leader, Hon. Jack Layton. He said that there would be no cuts to services to Canadian families.

When we look through the budget document tonight, what we see thoroughly and regularly are cuts to services to Canadian families. We have already seen the government, in Victoria, cut back

long-term health care funding. The Minister of Finance and the Prime Minister know that full well.

Starting in just a few years, the dismal decades under the Conservatives, we will see an increase in the retirement age, which will mean more seniors living in poverty. More seniors are living longer.

Canadian families deserve better than the budget that has been tabled tonight. They deserve better than the cuts in services, cuts we have already seen from the government in long-term health care funding, and now cuts to retirement security, and cuts to services that Canadian families depend on every day.
