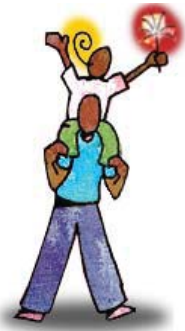

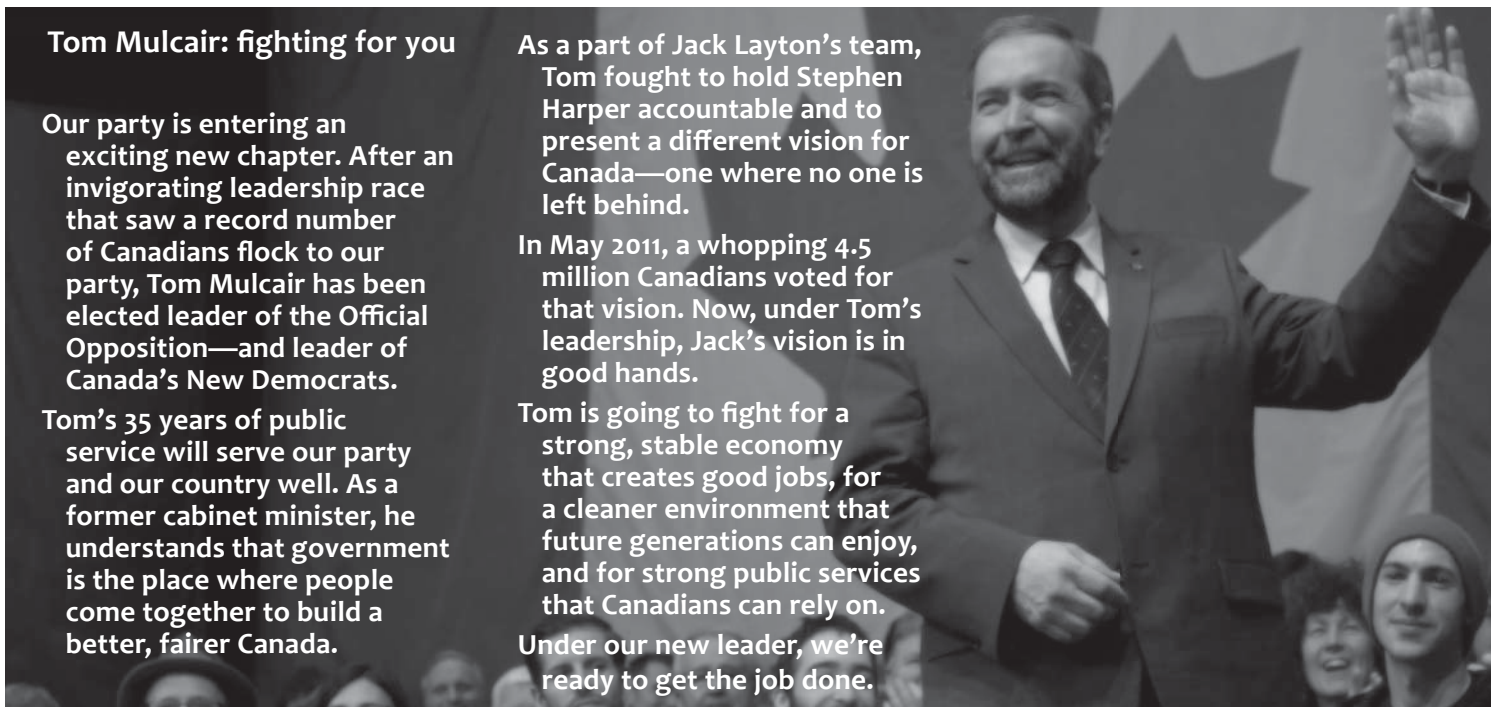
Tom's 35 years of public service will serve our party and our country well. As a former cabinet minister, he understands that government is the place where people come together to build a better, fairer Canada.

“I attended a meeting chaired by Peter Julian, MP for Burnaby-New Westminster in Spring 2009. It was a well prepared information meeting re. Disability Tax Credit. Since I had a disability since 1960, I did not know there would be some relief from the Federal Government until our MP held those meetings. I was able, after my doctor witnessed the Form T2201 that I was markedly disabled, to get a Tax Credit for the preceding ten years. My Tax Credit amounted to \$13,012.52. “Mr. Speaker, if the government is acting on behalf of Canadians, it should know that Canadians want and deserve a government that conducts responsible environmental reviews.

The government’s approach is irresponsible natural resources policy, irresponsible environmental policy and bad energy economics. To be sustainable over the long term and maintain access to markets, we

PETER IN THE HOUSE ~ Presenting Petitions ~ calling on a ban on oil tankers to protect our coast forever

Mr. Peter Julian (Burnaby—New Westminster, NDP): Mr. Speaker, I am very pleased to table, along with so many of my colleagues, a petition from 57,000 British Columbians who have stood up to say that we have to protect the north coast and legislate a ban on oil tankers to protect our coast forever.

These British Columbians who are writing and have signed these petitions are from north Vancouver Island, Nanaimo—Alberni, Chilliwack, the North Shore of Vancouver, the Lower Mainland,

Richmond and Surrey. They are also from interior communities in place like Kelowna, Prince George and Kamloops.

I am now realizing that these are communities where the MPs are Conservative.

Therefore, we are hoping that the government will listen to those 57,000 British Columbians who are asking that the government legislate a ban on oil tankers and protect the north coast of British Columbia forever.
